

How can Parents Support icontribute?

What is i-

contribute?

In the 1-contribute period each week pupils will develop a wide range of skills for life, learning and work as well as a sense of pride and achievement in giving something back to their communities.

Pupils will:

- > Investigate social issues that impact on our communities
- > Choose a local charity that supports these social issues
- Research the charity and the impact it has on the community
- Create an innovative pitch to give to their peers as to why their charity should be supported
- The winning teams as voted by their peers will go on to pitch to a judging panel
- The overall winner in S2 will be awarded £3000 for their charity

What Skills Will Pupils Devel-



- Research Skills—investigating local social issues and charities
- Analysis Skills—looking at information from the charity and putting this into their own words and sales pitch
- Communication and Presentation Skills—pupils will have to pitch to their peers and if they are successful move into the school final where we have a judging panel of pupils, staff and partners from business.
- Citizenship—looking at our democracy in Scotland—how does our voting system work and how we can participate
- Creativity—designing an innovative pitch using a variety of techniques such as music composition, video production

How does i-contribute relate to Modern Studies?



- Part of the year pupils will be examining the features of our democracy in Scotland—'first past the post' and 'proportional representation'.
- Proportional representation will then be used in action to decide on how our charity collection money is allocated and the winners who will proceed to the i-discover final
