1. Gillian opened the meeting with introductions, thanked everyone for attending and passed on the Parent Council (PC) congratulations to Claire McTiernan on her promotion to Depute Head Teacher.

2. Minutes of the last meeting on 20 November 2018 were proposed by Claire Kerr and seconded by Louise Elder.

## 3. SCHOOL CAPTAIN UPDATE

The School Captain updated the PC on various pupil achievements since the last PC Meeting, these included success in shotput, swimming, table tennis, running, Tae Kwon Do, S1-3 girls football and volleyball.

Matthew Fontaine from James Young won the recent West Lothian Council competition to name the new road gritters.

The Pop-Up Prom fashion show on 19 December was very successful and attendees were extremely impressed with the confidence of the students. The Head Teacher is currently exploring options within the school for the long term storage of the donated prom clothes.

#### 4. TREASURER'S REPORT

£6,041 in the account with commitments of £1,500 towards the JYHS Reads programme, so far the first £500 instalment has been made, the school will advise PC when the next instalment is needed. Bank signatory forms were passed to the new Treasurer. Moving forward, there is a need to fundraise.

#### 5. **HEAD TEACHER REPORT**

The Head Teacher provided a report on recent activities within the school as follows:

**Senior Phase Parents Evening** – held over two nights and was well attended.

**Prelims** – final prelims held this week, teachers are now starting to analyse the results to ensure pupils who need it get the help they need. An assembly will be held next week, focus going forward will be on study techniques (especially for those sitting Highers). Twilight Support has started earlier this year which meant a short notice deadline although students can still sign up for this. Targeted

support will follow shortly, Study for Success is also running at the library. Details of all exam support classes will be available on the school website. There are also Master Classes due to start soon for students studying Highers English and Maths.

**Depute Head Teacher** also mentioned Course Content information is now available on the school Website with the S2-6 Careers Event being held at the school on 31 January. Claire Kerr highlighted an issue with the Course Content web link asking for a Google account, Depute Head Teacher to investigate/correct.

The JYHS Library recently received a Gold Award from the School Library Services – UK, congratulations and a special mention to the library monitors for their help.

- Miss Casey currently standing in for Ms Dewar who is recovering well from her illness and hopes to be back at JYHS soon.

- Currently advertising for a Music Teacher as Miss Beattie is due to leave as the end of session.
- Due to the gap in German teachers, the focus will move to French/Spanish with those studying S3 and above continuing to receive German as a priority. Sarah Henley highlighted this is not ideal for those children having studied German in primary, the Head Teacher is aware and continues to work on this.

**Professional Learning Leadership Academy** – the Head Teacher talked about her plans to relaunch and refocus this initiative to help grow and strengthen the teachers at JYHS.

**Parent Toolkit** – thanks from Head Teacher to the PC for completing the questionnaire which will be used in conjunction with the teachers completed questionnaire to update the school improvement plans.

**Study Leave** – information to be added to the school website as soon as possible.

#### 6. CEDAR BANK SCHOOL RELOCATION TO JYHS GROUNDS

Head Teacher advised that unfortunately Mr Jim Cameron was unable to attend the meeting but Melanie Lawrie will shortly be arranging a date to present to all parents and interested local residents on the proposal to relocate Cedar Bank School to JYHS grounds.

Peter Heggie, as a member of the local council, was able to provide some additional information. Cedar Bank provides special support needs over 3 sites for 130 pupils, the driver is to relocate this to one mainstream school in West Lothian and JYHS is being considered for this. The pre consultation process has begun, decision expected to be made by the end of August/beginning of September. Issues discussed included: impact on access to school grounds, which feeder primaries does Cedar Bank cater for, new accommodation to be built in JYHS but where in grounds and keen to see results

of impact analysis, it will remain a separate entity, will additional resources be available to JYHS, possible congestion may be addressed by Cedar Bank children arriving later and leaving earlier or opening an entrance from the Aldi side of the school.
