

Virtual Work Placements and Work Related Learning Opportunities – COVID19 response part 1

This resource was produced in response to the Coronavirus pandemic, and as part of a recovery/resilience plan for the Work Placement Programme as it may be some time before we're safely able to offer work placements again (especially with social distancing measures continuing).

Current restrictions allow us to view virtual work placements and work related learning experiences as a truly viable and worthwhile alternative to 'physical placements'.

Such opportunities can provide access to new, non-traditional and/or remote audiences that couldn't previously participate in physical placements; whether that's because of the limitations imposed due to confidentiality/sensitivity issues within the sector (e.g. NHS), health and safety reasons, or disadvantaged groups of individuals (e.g. students with special needs, or disabilities) who may not have been accommodated in the past. Virtual placements (with or without virtual support) could break down these barriers, offering 'equal opportunities' for all.

Students who aren't ready for a virtual placement may take part in the activities under 'Work Related Learning/inspiration' section below.

DofE	There are four sections to complete at Bronze and Silver level and five at Gold. They involve helping the community/environment, becoming fitter, developing new skills, planning, training for and completing an expedition and, for Gold only, working with a team on a residential activity.
	Any young person can do their DofE – regardless of ability, gender, background or location. Achieving an Award isn't a competition or about being first. It's all about setting personal challenges and pushing personal boundaries.
	Through a DofE programme young people have fun, make friends, improve their self-esteem and build confidence.
